Operating Facilities— our standards

When this practice was set up, we agreed that we would have operating facilities second to none, and we would apply standards second to none.

- ◆ All operations are carried out under strict aseptic conditions, and the surgeon wears scrubs, hat, mask and gloves. This is not standard in every veterinary practice!
- ◆ Access to the operating theatre is strictly controlled to maintain asepsis.
- ◆ We are using THE best , and THE safest anaesthetics that money can buy.

- ◆ All patients under anaesthetic are monitored by trained staff backed up by some of the most up to date monitoring equipment available. We can monitor
 - ◆ ECG
 - ◆ Blood % oxygen
 - ◆ Inspired and expired gases
 - ◆ Blood pressure
 - ◆ Core body temperature
 - ◆ Respiratory and heart rate.

Your pet's life is in our hands— we don't ever forget this!
